It's been another very busy and exciting month in Junior Gardening. At Concordia, the native wildflower seeds planted in the entrance beautification beds in December are already starting to flower! We can't wait to bring students out there to identify the different flowers, some very new to me too! This CA native garden serves as another outdoor classroom that includes habitat plants with Native American uses.

Concordia's K/1st grade habitat/5 senses garden was upgraded recently with the addition of brick borders that also expanded the sustainable habitat/5 senses perimeter garden. The PTA also funded a stone garden bench for story time in the garden! Kindergarten will replant their veggie beds with seeds very soon. Students will be spending 20 minutes twice a week with teachers and parents in the garden. Thanks Simone, and parents Rachelle (w/Justin), Dallas, and others for all your help this month!

Concordia's rain barrel project is underway. Two dedicated parents helped with cleaning out and painting the primer color on the 7 recycled barrels. Then Isobel, Simone, Dolly, Deidra, and I traced more than 200 student art designs on them! Thank you ladies! What fun students will have expressing themselves artistically and painting their images soon!

Marblehead's garden project is moving along too. Stephanie received a generous donation of butterfly plants from our friends at Plant Depot to start their garden off and is in the process of preparing for the 2nd graders to begin planting their metamorphosis garden soon. Pollinator Project San Clemente State Beach Park

Just look at what we've helped accomplish at San Clemente State Beach! The Pollinator Restoration Project led by Park Interpreter, Cryssie Brommer has been a great success story. Pictured here is the 'corral bed' located at the entrance to the park near the guard station. This was planted on Earth Day 2010 with help from the Club, SCHS students, park personnel, and the community.



In late October 2010, just as we began to see the monarchs returning to SCSB for their winter habitat, the Club assisted with amending the soil and planting native habitat plants seeds. As you may know, the park's wintering monarchs returned in record numbers, and represented the largest population in Orange County! This is cause for celebration. Recently, the Club donated and planted three 6' tall Western Sycamore trees at the park, as part of its continued effort to support the pollinator project. It just happens that monarchs use these native trees for clustering as well as the Eucalyptus. While visiting the park recently, I witnessed this female monarch lay an egg in the corral bed (left) and another migrant female nectaring there (right).

Kris' ongoing community goals include: sustainable school gardens; environmental education; natural resource conservation; and active participation in establishing and preserving pollinator habitats – all through community outreach.

Kris Ethington is passionate about increasing environmental awareness, volunteerism, and San Clemente pride by re-connecting community with nature through youth gardening and stewardship programs. Making a difference in our community, Kris, as SCGC JR. GARDENER PROGRAM CHAIR, is enjoying the third year of her award winning LEARNING THROUGH NATURE (LTN) environmental education program. Kris, with over 1,100 volunteer hours, leads the PTA, parents, grandparents, siblings, teachers, and most importantly (635) current (and 200 former) students at CONCORDIA ELEMENTARY in planning, creating, and maintaining four grade-based gardens. Kris develops lessons and creates teaching materials tied to CA educational Science standards by grade, K-5, with hands-on gardening through butterfly habitats and growing vegetables. Also, students learn to appreciate water resources through native plant gardens and rainwater harvesting. CONCORDIA already has 7 rain barrels, a project funded through City grants. Students then learn to reduce/recycle/reuse through composting lessons and in-class vermiculture bins. Public access to gardens is available with school permission. Additionally, Kris established and leads a monthly after school volunteer garden maintenance program, involving (200+) residents. Kris is currently mentoring the leader of a similar school garden program underway at MARBLEHEAD ELEMENTARY, involving (629) students and their families. She's also giving guidance to teachers establishing an instructional garden at SHORECLIFF'S MIDDLE SCHOOL.

Kris Ethington is responsible for the successful Jr. Gardener Butterfly Conservation/Education Booth at SCGC GardenFest. She initiated CONCORDIA's participation in CA School Garden Week. At national, state, and local levels, Kris won numerous awards, recognitions, and grants for her volunteer work (details on request). CONCORDIA received a 2010 CA Distinguished School Award for increased academic performance, significantly due to the LTN Science Program. Separately, **Kris Ethington**, a valued volunteer at SC STATE BEACH (SCSB) park, helps lead the native plant pollinator restoration project involving (20+) SCHS Environmental Science students and community members, seasonally and during Earth Day planting projects. As a record number of monarch butterflies returned to the SCSB overwintering site in 2010, Kris continued her dedication to conservation by working with scientists to help monitor and participate in a migration tagging study at the park, creating substantial community interest in observing and conserving the monarch's winter habitat.

The Garden Club considers **Kris Ethington** ideal for 2011 Wall of Recognition because her volunteer activities touch and will continue to touch untold grateful students and community members. Kris' ongoing, enduring, gratifying commitment brings to San Clemente continuing delights and pleasures of school gardens and monarch butterflies, directly enhancing the City. Kris involves and benefits students, residents and visitors by promoting interactive environmental stewardship and social responsibility, inspiring an escalation of scientific discovery Citywide.
