Hypertufa Workshop from Kim Neal

On **Friday, November 18**, a Hypertufa workshop was held at the home of Launa Gould. This workshop has been very popular with club members in the past. That proved true again this year with 20 participants registered to attend.

The workshop was led by San Clemente resident **Cleo Demarco**, who is a Hypertufa aficionado, and graciously agreed to share her time and knowledge. There are two more workshops scheduled. The first is in January (Moss-Covered Terracotta Pots and Propagation) and the second will be held in March (Terrariums) of 2023. Moss-Covered Terracotta Pots and Propagation Workshop from Kim Neal

Teresa Whitney has, once again, graciously agreed to host the January workshop at her home. The workshop is scheduled for Monday, January 23, 2023, 9 am.

This workshop serves two purposes: **Moss Covered Terracotta Pots:** Learn how to mix 'living paint' and coat an unglazed terracotta pot with the slurry. Then watch it grow over time. Cost: \$5, payable on the day of the workshop. Advance registration for this part of the workshop is due no later than **Friday**, **December 9**, to ensure that enough materials are on hand for all participants.

Propagation: Consider learning new propagation skills or just refresh your old ones. The propagation part of the workshop, led by **Launa Gould**, will cover techniques to ensure your success when propagating plants in your own garden. The skills we learn will be put to use on the day of the workshop as we propagate plants which will be sold at the **April GardenFest plant sale**. You do not have to create a moss-covered terracotta pot in order to participate in the propagation portion of the workshop. Cost: No Charge

Tree City USA from Patricia Holloway

Last October 18 the San Clemente City Council unanimously approved sending an application to the **National Arbor Day Foundation** to request designation as a Tree City USA. To be eligible, our city must meet four criteria:

- 1. Maintain a tree board or department
- 2. Have a city tree ordinance
- 3. Spend at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry annually
- 4. Celebrate Arbor Day

The city complies with these criteria and will be required to stay compliant in order to receive this annual designation. The council asked staff to update the existing City Tree Policy, which is over 20 years old. Two public workshops will be scheduled in the future to obtain community input, so feel free to share your thoughts when the time comes.

The city's Arbor Day celebration will be held on **April 28, 2023**, at **Forester Ranch Community Park**. Our Garden Club board generously agreed to donate \$620 to the city to plant two 24-inch box trees at the event. Our San Clemente Rotary, Sunrise Rotary, and local chapter of Citizens' Climate Education will also be donating trees and celebrating alongside SCGC.

More details to come in the new year about public workshops, Arbor Day, and expanding our "Village Forest."
