Speaker, Jan Siegel, a lover of history and a detective who has discovered the source and connections of many a local tale and character, has given her many talents of organizing and writing skills to the city of SJC as well as to the local SJC Historical Society. She served on the city's Cultural Heritage Commission for 13 years, as a guide for the SJC architectural walks for 26 years and is on the Historical Society's board as museum curator for the Mission SJC's archives. She has been named Woman of the Year, Volunteer of the Year and has been inducted into the city's Wall of Recognition.

Repurposed Dead Trees from Susan Pierce

When I learned that the January speaker's subject was about dead trees, I was reminded of a tour I took while on an Alaskan cruise.

One of my sightseeing trips was in **Juneau**, **Alaska**. I selected a garden tour thinking it would be a tour much like members often take. Much to my surprise this one was very different.

Glacier Gardens offers tours within a portion of the Tongass National Forest. The garden center owner spent a great deal of time and energy clearing many fallen trees after a severe storm.

Tour participants were told that the owner used all types of heavy equipment to clear these trees. Rather than turn them into lumber or compost or haul away, he dug very deep holes in the land. Next he placed a fallen tree upside down in the hole. Because Glacier Gardens is also a typical nursery, he planted a variety of plants into the roots (now facing the sky). These trees may also be referred to as flower towers. Relocating these trees allowed him to create a road throughout his portion of the forest, which provided tourists an opportunity to view these beautifully planted trees and the majesty of the rainforest.

It was definitely a creative way to save the barren ground after the snow and trees fallen by wind, landslides, and snow. It was beautiful to see.

If you ever find yourself in Juneau, I recommend you visit to see the beautifully planted upside down trees. The garden center is open May-September.

New Signage at Park Semper Fi from Laura Bard

Come by and check out the informative Monarch Butterfly/Milkweed signage just installed at Park Semper Fi! A collaboration of **San Clemente Rotary Clubs** and **San Clemente Garden Club**, the signage is posted adjacent to native milkweed (Asclepius fascicularis) that was planted late last spring. The plants at Park Semper Fi and Casa Romantica were donated by **San Clemente Sunrise Rotary** and signage was donated **San Clemente Evening Rotary**.
