
Garden Club Website from Kim Neal, webmaster

Potting With Diapers from Susan Pierce

I recently read an article about an unusual way to keep potted plants from drying out in the hot weather. As we know, clay pots loose moisture more frequently than other types of containers. To help retain moisture in the soil, you simply put the contents of this unusual item into the potting soil. What is it? Disposable diapers. They have hydrogel in them to make sure they absorb and retain liquids. This is what garden stores sell as water retention crystals.

Just buy the least expensive box of disposable diapers you can find. Then simply tear open a diaper and pour the contents into a mixing bowl. If there are little pieces of cotton in the bowl, leave them as they also help absorb water. Next add water to the mixture until there is a gel consistency, then add equal parts of potting soil. This combination mixture can be used in pots for your new plants. It must not be used in plantings for fruit, herbs, or vegetables, however.

If you are the person who doesn't want to have dirty hands, there is another option to use the disposable diaper. Peel away the part that would be against a baby's bottom and place in the bottom of the pot. For larger pots or planters, one or more diapers might be needed. Cut holes in the bottom part of the diaper so the soil can drain and not drown the roots. Also, remember that this method is for non-edible plants too.
