Arbor Day March 7 from CGCI

California's Arbor Day is celebrated on March 7 in honor of famed horticulturist Luther Burbank's birthday. The celebration may continue until March 14. Thanks to the passion and gusto of a tree-lover named J. Sterling Morton, Arbor Day was first celebrated in Nebraska on April 10, 1872, by planting an estimated one million trees on the treeless prairie. Since its inception in the 1800's, Arbor Day has been celebrated around the nation as a day to plant and care for trees.

Morton believed that the beauty of trees was a reason unto itself: "To preserve beauty on the earth, to plant trees, and renew dead landscapes with the shadow and light of plant life flitting through the pendant limbs, the willowy boughs and the waving foliage of sturdy, yet graceful woods. Our ancestors planted orchards to fruit for us, and homes to give us shelter. Each of those reposes upon the past, while Arbor Day proposes for the future. It contemplates, not the good and the beautiful of past generations, but it sketches, outlines, establishes the useful and beautiful for the ages yet to come."

A century after the holiday was first celebrated, the Arbor Day Foundation was created to continue encouraging people to plant and love trees.
