Garden Tips from Virginia Churchill

Tomatoes are so plentiful now!

To remove the skins, especially off the funny shapes of Heirloom tomatoes, just submerge in boiling water.

To remove the skin from tomatoes, yet keeping them raw, just submerge one carefully into boiling water and simmer for 30 seconds to one minute. (Adjust for size). Remove the tomato and place in ice cold water to stop the cooking.

When cool enough to handle, peel. The skin should remove easily. Use anywhere you would use a raw tomato.

For a delicious salad, just slice and add olive oil, salt, pepper, or other spices to taste and top with fresh basil and/or arugula. Yummy!

Huntington Rose Fertilizer Formula

from Laura Bard

Here's the 'witches brew' used on the rose garden at the Huntington. You can adjust quantities to your needs, just keep the ratios the same.

1 gallon water

- 1 Tsp Verde (Can get at Humboldt nutrients (model V405)
- 1 Tsp Jumpstart plant tonic (Grow more #7436)
- 1/2 Tbsp Seaweed Extract (Grow more #6048)

Use as a foliar feed in late January or early February after pruning and before 1st bloom and once again after 1st bloom, usually April depending on weather.

Cover Up Weeds! from Susan Pierce

Save money on weed killers by spreading several layers of newspaper on the soil before mulching over them in the garden. This blocks weeds from growing and helps retain moisture. Saves your watering needs too by watering the plants less.




CA Native Substitutes for Common Landscape Trees

Fall is the ideal time to plant California native trees. Native plant expert Art Tyree, in collaboration with Tree of Life Nursery, has identified several praiseworthy native trees to replace common exotic landscape choices. If you're interested in adding trees to your yard, or need to replace a dying or diseased tree, take a look at this list. Not only will these native trees use less water once established, but they will sustain and attract our native birds and wildlife. Next time you visit the nursery, ask for The Handy Plant "Respecifier" brochure (also available on TOL's website at californianativeplants.com).

EXOTIC	CA NATIVE	
Thinking Of	Think Again	
Eucalyptus	Deliver us from Australia with California's own texture and character trees: Lyonothamnus (e.g., Catalina Ironwood, Santa Cruz Island Ironwood), Pinus torreyana (Torrey Pine), Platanus racemosa (California Sycamore).	
Ficus (Fig)	Too dense, tropical, shady, and too many surface roots. Consider <i>Quercus</i> (e.g., Coast Live Oak), <i>Platanus racemosa</i> (California Sycamore), <i>Umbellularia californica</i> (California Bay), and <i>Prunus</i> (e.g., Catalina Cherry, Hollyleaf Cherry) as superior natives.	
Magnolia	Leave this southern belle in the South. Out west we prefer <i>Quercus</i> (Oak), <i>Prunus</i> (e.g., Catalina Cherry, Hollyleaf Cherry), <i>Cercis occidentalis</i> (Western Redbud), <i>Umbellularia californica</i> (California Bay).	
Melaleuca (Paperbark Tree)	No need to import this Aussie. Stick with <i>Quercus engelmanii</i> (Engelmann Oak), <i>Arctostaphylos manzanita</i> (Common Manzanita), <i>or Lyonothamnus</i> (e.g., Catalina Ironwood, Santa Cruz Island Ironwood).	
Pinus (Pine)	Instead of the habitual choices, consider <i>Pinus torreyana</i> (Torrey Pine) or <i>Pinus coulteri</i> (Coulter Pine) as large pines.	
Prunus (Stone Fruit) Pyrus (Flowering Pear)	, Cercis occidentalis (Western Redbud) is stronger, flowers longer. Prunus lyonii (Catalina Cherry) makes a fine small canopy tree.	
Schinus (Peruvian Pepper aka California Pepper)	Traditional, historical S. molle doesn't compare to <i>Quercus agrifolia</i> (Coast Live Oak).	
Cupaniopsis (Carrotwood)	For a clean, small but stately shade tree look at <i>Umbelullaria californica</i> (California Bay), <i>Aesculus californica</i> (California Buckeye).

- Learn about this aromatic, silvery shrub that is native to Southern California and Northern Baja and grows nowhere else in the world!
- Enjoy a short documentary, "Saging the World", about the deep spiritual significance this plant has for California Indigenous communities, and how it is endangered by illegal harvesting in massive quantities from our local wildlands to satisfy worldwide demand for smudge sticks, incense, and herbal medicine.
- Pick up a FREE 4"pot of White Sage to plant in your own garden!
 (One per household while supplies last.) White sage will thrive anywhere in Orange County, even in a container. It likes full sun, is drought resistant and virtually pest free.



White Sage (Salvia apiana) is a fragrant shrub that grows 2 to 3 feet tall with silvery leaves and spikes of white/lavender flowers in spring. Its leaves shine white in a moonlit garden.
