October 4 Meeting Program Gabe Verduzco Invasive Tree Insects in Southern California

Gabe Verduzco is a Regional Arborist Advisor, part time park ranger for local nature preserves and helps with the CNPS OC chapter. His previous experience includes work with UC cooperative extension in Irvine with invasive insects, a horticulturalist at a botanic garden, and research assistant at the USDA Research facility.

Gabe is an ISA Certified Arborist (International Society of Arboriculture). His presentation will be on

the invasive shot hole borer, gold spotted oak borer and South American palm weevil. These non-native insect pests are destroying many of our native and non-native tree species in Southern California. We will look at the background of the pests, biology, signs, symptoms and management.




our own **Robin Nelson** in memory of her husband, **Andrew Nelson**, who passed away in 2021.

Andy was in ROTC at Arizona State University. He was also in the Arizona Army National Guard where he was the powder man on a 155 millimeter howitzer. His job was to count out the required number of bags of powder to set the charge as ordered by the commanding officer.

He was an experienced sharp-shooter and won many competitions all over the US. After graduating from college, Andy spent a year in Vietnam. He was an officer in the Army in charge of a boat unit. He also volunteered to be a helicopter gunner on a medivac unit. He was the first off the helicopter to protect the medics and the last on to protect the injured and medics. "He knew his time was coming up as two bullets hit next to his head as they were taking off. Fortunately, this all happened before we met!" said Robin Nelson, "I was fortunate to spend almost 51 years with this courageous man."

As club members spent time working in the gardens in September, a couple from Arizona stopped to talk to us and mentioned how beautifully the gardens were maintained. They thanked the club for their work. If you are unable to work in the gardens, take a stroll through Park Semper Fi and pay homage to the heroes who sacrificed for all of us. The Executive Committee at the September board meeting voted to add a Standing Rule to our bylaws that allows only communication of club events so as not to distract from the goals and mission of our club.


This Standing Rule #6 will be voted on at the October meeting.

The Old Banyan Tree from Patricia Holloway Most of you know about the devastating fires on Maui that destroyed the town of Lahaina in August. Nearly 100 lives were lost. Watching interviews with survivors, I was struck by the fact that residents grieved not only for their family members, homes, and businesses, but they also cried for the Old Banyan Tree.

Alongside emergency efforts to feed, clothe, and house the people, locals are tending to the massive tree venerated as the heartbeat of Lahaina. Arborists hope that aeration, compost tea, and regular watering will bring the fire damaged banyan back to life.

The tree, which turned 150 years old last April, was planted in 1873 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Protestant Mission in Lahaina.

The banyan (Ficus benghalensis) is a non-native species from India. It's height at planting was just 8-feet tall. Today the tree stands more than 60 feet high and spans 2-acres in length. Its 16 trunks total a quarter mile in circumference, making it the largest banyan in the U.S. and one of the largest in the world. Banyan trees have aerial roots that sprout from branches. When they touch the ground, they can implant and become trunks. Because of this, they're sometimes called "walking trees".
